Here are some questions to help you remember what you read when we do the assignment. You don't have to answer them in print, but you should be able to answer them when asked. (Make a copy of this doc to do it digitally.)

**Title and Author:** What is the title and author of your book? What is the genre (mystery, humor, realistic fiction, etc)?

Characterization: Who are the main characters? What do they look like and how do they act?

**Setting:** Where and when does this story take place? What is the feeling you get throughout the story as a reader?

**Conflict:** What is the main problem (or conflict) in the story?

**Theme:** What message about life (or moral) is the author trying to reveal through the story?
